2010 International Study Trip

# Slovakia

Cornell's Agribusiness Fellows Program provides undergraduate students the opportunity to travel abroad to observe and interact one-on-one with agribusiness leaders in different countries. In 2010, the Agribusiness Fellows will travel to Slovakia during the week after spring semester final exams. Tentative dates are May 22–28, but actual departure and return dates may be altered by a few days.

With planning assistance from the Slovak Agricultural University, we will travel and visit a wide variety of agricultural businesses, including importers and exporters, trade groups, input suppliers, farms, agritourism businesses, food manufacturers, food wholesalers, and food retailers.

Because the Warren Fund has provided funding for a significant portion of the field study, each student will be required to make a co-payment of only \$800. Students will also be responsible for paying for their meals (some will be provided) and other incidental expenses.

Applications for the program are due January 19, 2010 and may be obtained from Judy Neno in Warren 154. Students will be interviewed, and selections will be made based upon the application and a personal interview.

After completing the study trip and preparing a paper, students will receive two credits for the Spring 2010 semester under AEM 329: International Agribusiness Study Trip.
